
WHAT IS A WHISTLEBLOWER?

Whis*tle*blow*er (noun)


- 1. One whose loyalty is to the truth.
- 2. One who reports securities fraud, corruption, or other violations of law to the appropriate authorities, often risking his or her job or security.
- 3. One who discloses bribery of government officials by persons seeking to obtain a business advantage.





On March 2, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln signed the original whistleblower reward law, the False Claims Act. It was modernized in 1986. Since then it has become the most successful anti-fraud law in the United States. The "impact" of the reward laws "has been nothing short of profound. Some of these [cases] may have saved lives. All of them saved money."





THE FIVE STEPS

FOR CREATING AN EFFECTIVE WHISTLEBLOWER PROGRAM



<u>Step One</u> Protect Confidentiality

Create a secure and confidential mechanism for whistleblowers to report potential crimes.



Step 2 Prohibit Retaliation

Provide strong administrative and judicial protections for employees who suffer retaliation for making a protected disclosures. Remedies should include reinstatement, back pay, compensatory and punitive damages and attorney fees.

<u>Step 3</u> Pay Rewards

The best method to incentivize whistleblowers to report fraud and illegal conduct is to provide for financial rewards based on the quality of original information provided to the government.

Step 4

Program Rules Should Attract High Quality Information

Whistleblowers who qualify for a reward must be guaranteed a minimum percentage reward (not less then 10%) and have a right to judicial review if a claim is denied. There should be no "caps" on the amount of a reward.

<u>Step 5</u>

Establish a Whistleblower Office

A Whistleblower Office is needed ot coordinate submissions, publicize the program and ensure that rewards are paid at the highest possible level to incentivize whistleblowers and promote voluntary corporate compliance.


